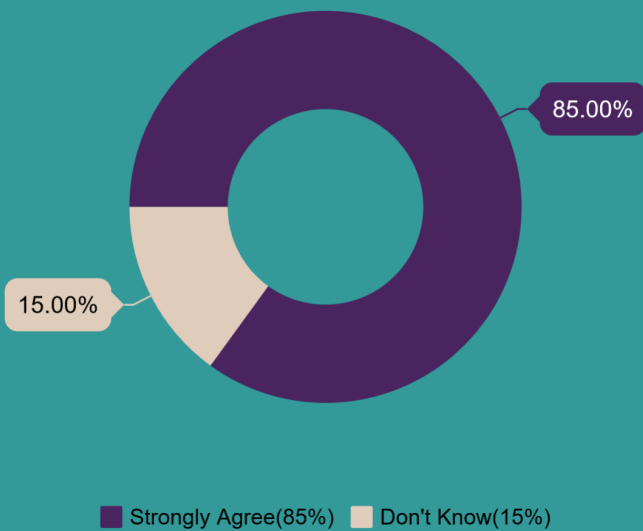
Faith and Enrichment Program

Year 3 Results * Bronx, NY

El Camino ("the Way") is a daily after school program that provides academic support, enrichment, and character and faith formation for under-served children who cannot afford a Catholic school.

In its third year (2015-16), El Camino served over 120 children from ages 5 to 9 in the South Bronx. Twenty nine children affiliated with El Camino entered the Church through Baptism. Below are highlights of our results.

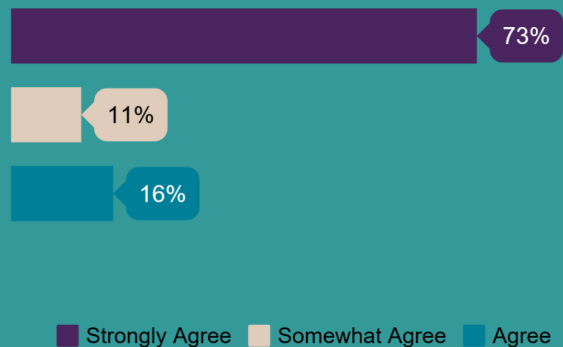
Growing in Character

As a parent, I want to strengthen my relationship with God.



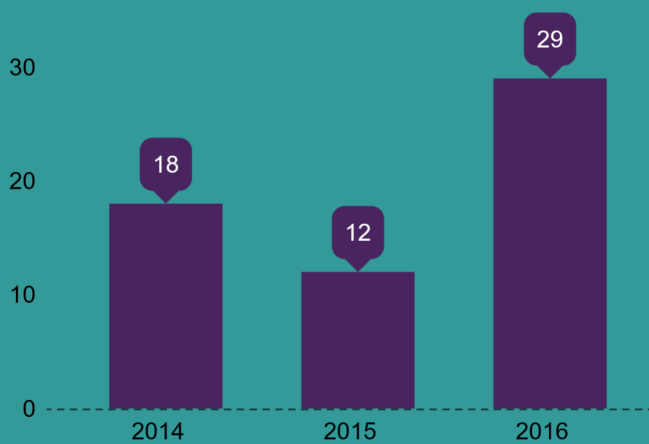
Understanding the Catholic Faith

Three quarters of children mastered 80% of grade appropriate catechetical content in accordance with guidelines from the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops.

100% of children knew the Sign of the Cross, Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be. 80% mastered the Act of Contrition.

Sacrament of Baptism



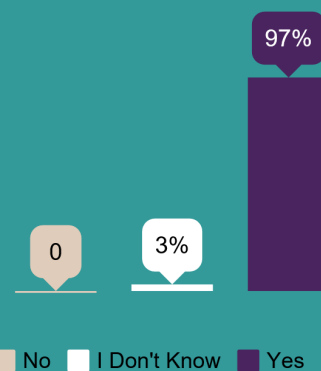
El Camino partners with St. Rita's parish in the Bronx to offer our disciples and families the Sacrament of Baptism, Reconciliation, and First Holy Communion.
